

James E. McClellan, Jr., is a visiting professor of logic and the classics at Corpus Christi State University. He recently retired as Professor from State University of New York at Albany (SUNYA). He had previously served on the faculties of Florida State Teachers College, Teachers College - Columbia University, and Temple University as well as visiting lecturer at Johns Hopkins, Harvard, University of Kansas City, Cornell, and Syracuse.

Prof. McClellan has served as a consultant to the U.S. Office of Economic Opportunity, New Jersey Department of Education, and SUNY Research Development Board, Educational Policy Research Center. He has been the recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship and was designated a SUNYA Faculty Scholar from 1977 until his retirement in 1987.

Prof. McClellan's numerous publications include Education and the New America (New York: Random House, 1962), Toward An Effective Critique of American Education (Philadelphia: J.B. Lippincott Co., 1966), Philosophy of Education (Englewood Cliffs, N.J.: Prentice-Hall, Inc., Foundations of Philosophy Series, 1976). His other publications include contributions to Progressive Education, Teachers College Record, Comparative Educational Theory, Harvard Education Review, McGill Journal of Education, and Philosophical Forum.

Prof. McClellan is a member of the Texas Foundations of Education Society. He is a native Texan from Temple, Texas and attended Rice University and received his B.S. from the University of Texas before receiving his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Illinois.
